

Directions

- 1. Use pliers to screw points into end of burner pen.
- 2. Plug in burner and switch on to heat.
- 3. Place in stand and wait 10 minutes for burner to heat.
- 4. Hold burner like you would a pencil.
- 5. Holding burner too tightly will cause fingers to get hot.
- 6. Do not touch point or metal parts of burner when hot.
- 7. Turn off and allow to cool down before changing point.
- 8. Do not use near water.
- 9. Tips: To sharpen or clean, use a fine emery board.

Stencil Cutter

Easy to use curved tip is great for small, intricate designs. Straight tip is great for broad or straight cuts.


- 1. Tape the stencil blank over the design and trace the pattern with a permanent marker.
- 2. Practice first! Hold the cutter like a pen and trace the pattern using light pressure. Too much pressure may bend or break the tip. To protect your table while you cut, use the glass from a picture frame.
- 3. Pace yourself! Moving too quickly or slowly will cause uneven melting. For smooth cut edges, do not abruptly lift tip up while in the middle of tracing a line.

Wood Burner

- 1. Use a scrap piece of wood to practice using the burner.
- 2. Points react differently to different types of wood.
- 3. Go slowly to achieve darker lines.
- 4. Move wood piece as you work.
